

G. Zhiyong Lan is Professor of Public Administration in the School of Public Affairs, Arizona State University. He obtained his B.A. degree from Nanjing University, PRC, his MPA degree (Master of Public Administration) from North Carolina State University, and his Ph.D. degree in Public Administration from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, Syracuse University.

Professor Lan teaches and researches in areas of general public administration theory, research methodology, information technology and resources management/policy, organizational studies, government and business relationships, local government and economic development, and comparative public administration. So far, he has published 2 books, over 50 journal articles, book chapters, and other publications. The journals he has published articles in including *Brown Journal of World Affairs*, *Public Administration Review*, *American Review of Public Administration*, *Journal of Public Administration: Theory and Research*, *Administration and Society*, *Journal of Government Information*, *Information Resources Management Journal*, *Journal of American-East Asian Studies*, *Asian Journal of Public Administration*, *Asian Thought and Society*, *Chinese Public Administration Review*, etc. He has also published monographs, newspaper articles, book reviews, research reports and conference proceedings, and presented more than 30 papers at national, international, and regional conferences.

Professor Lan serves on two editorial boards, serves as a board member of the Science and Technology Section of ASPA (American Society of Public Administration), and as a referee for a number of public administration journals.
